Northeastern Illinois University's College of Arts and Sciences is offering a great opportunity for high school students to get an early college experience, fully supported by scholarships!

## Dual Enrollment Overview

You'll earn 3 credits on a NEIU transcript that are widely transferable to many other institutions. You'll be taking a real college course with NEIU students, supported by NEIU advisors and staff to optimize your success; and you'll have a student ID giving you all the privileges of any other NEIU student: access to the library, the gym, student services, and more! You'll connect with other motivated high school students from around the city.

## Space is Limited!

Students must meet certain academic requirements for admission, including a recommendation from their counselor or principal.

## Requirements

- High school junior or senior in good standing. Priority will be given to seniors attending NEIU in Fall 2022.
- Minimum cumulative unweighted grade point average of 2.85
- Signed recommendation form from the principal or guidance counselor
- Apply to NEIU admission
- Official transcript
- Parental Consent Form
- Student and parent/legal guardian must participate in a mandatory orientation.

Complete interest form by **November 17, 2021**. Some late applications may be considered, but scholarships and space in classes are limited.

# Courses

## This Spring 2022, High School Students Are Eligible to Enroll In:

### **ART 120: Drawing 1**

Tuesday and Thursdays | 4:10 pm - 6:40 pm

Take your passion for drawing to the next level. If you are artistically inclined, but have no previous formal training, this class can rapidly improve your ability to draw things objectively or “realistically.” While it assumes no previous instruction, a dedicated enthusiasm for the subject, responsibility for completing assignments and mature behavior in a studio classroom are requirements for the course.

This is a face-to-face studio course. All Covid-19 guidelines will be followed such as social distancing and required face coverings. The format of the course involves long sessions in the studio, which will give you extended time for uninterrupted work with support of the professor.

The course will be taught at NEIU Main Campus.

### **CMTC 101: Public Speaking**

Monday and Wednesday | 4:15 pm - 5:30 pm

Learn how to present yourself well to others. This course will help you navigate all your questions and even anxieties you may have about speaking to audiences large or small. Organizing your thoughts ahead of time is the biggest gift you can give yourself. In a supportive environment many things are possible!

The course will be taught remotely on Zoom.

### **MATH 112: Statistics in Daily Life**

Tuesday and Thursdays | 4:15 pm - 5:30 pm

As humans we often want to know what a population thinks, how it will perform, etc. For example, advertisers would like to know what percent of people would be swayed/influenced by their ads. In this introduction to statistics course, students will learn to: process and classify data; create and assess models; use descriptive statistics and inferential statistics; and use spreadsheets and/or a graphing calculator (TI-83 or equivalent) to perform these tasks. Prerequisite: (SAT Math 530 - 800 or ACT Math 22 - 36 or NEIU Math Placement Result 30 - 40 or Accuplacer College Level Math 020 - 120 or Accuplacer Adv. Algebra & Func 237 - 300).

This is a face-to-face course. All Covid-19 guidelines will be followed such as social distancing and required face coverings.

The course will be taught at NEIU Main Campus.

### **PHIL 102: Introduction to Philosophy**

Monday and Wednesday | 4:15 pm - 5:30 pm

In this course we will examine some of the central themes of philosophy--including questions about what is real (metaphysics), what is right (ethics) and what I can know (epistemology). Questions we will discuss include “Is this painting beautiful?”; “How do I know I’m not living in a computer simulation?”; “If God exists why can’t I find any good peaches?”

Furthermore, we will answer some of our most pressing moral questions like how to respond when asked “Does this haircut look good?” or “Can I eat the aliens I discovered on another planet.” Finally, “Am I morally obligated to use the blinkers on my car?” (the last answer is YES).

The course will be taught remotely on Zoom.


## PSYC 100: Survey of Psychology
